Romania Receives OECD Approval and Recommendations for Regional Development

About the Disparities in Romania and the Impact of (Non-)Regionalization

In July 2024, the Ministry of Development, Public Works, and Administration issued a press release announcing that Romania has received official approval from the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) for its regional development policy. This statement highlights the recognition of Romania's efforts to strengthen its regional development policy, noting that the formal approval includes a series of recommendations for improving the policy framework, governance, and financing in this field. In addition to the relevance of the subject in the context of Romania's accession to the OECD, regional development is connected to some problems that Romania is currently facing, including the regional socio-economic imbalance, reflected by the discrepancies between the average GDP per capita in the

capital and the rest of the country.

Regional disparities are also present at the European level, with the convergence of less developed regions being a goal for the European Union (EU), supported by the allocation of approximately 30% of EU cohesion funds for economic, social, and territorial cohesion. In the Multiannual Financial Framework for 2021-2027, the Cohesion Policy remains the main investment policy. Romania is directly interested in the mechanisms for allocating structural funds, being one of the main beneficiary states.
